The School of Nursing at Cleveland State University offers both undergraduate and graduate nursing programs, which are accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). Our pre-licensure program is approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing (OBN). The programs are available to men and women who have been admitted to Cleveland State University and the School of Nursing.

The School of Nursing offers programs in the following areas:

- Traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program
- Accelerated Option in Nursing, a second degree that offers a BSN in 16 months (once all prerequisite courses are completed)
- RN to BSN, an online track in three consecutive semesters for practicing Registered Nurses
- MSN/MBA
- MSN (Specialized Population, Education, Clinical Nurse Leader, Forensics)

## SCHOOL OF NURSING

### Registered Nurse (RN) to Bachelor of Science (BSN) Completion—*Now Online*

If you are currently a Registered Nurse, add the Bachelor of Science in Nursing to your credentials. CSU's School of Nursing offers RN's the opportunity to earn the BSN degree with a flexible, online schedule. Students are admitted to the nursing program as juniors. The required nursing courses can be completed in three semesters.

Graduates are able to move into the Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) program following graduation if they meet all MSN requirements.

The School of Nursing participates in the Ohio Nursing Articulation Model (ONAM). ONAM agreements among Ohio Nursing Schools support educational mobility through recognition of prior nursing coursework, allowing advanced placement without testing or repetitive nursing coursework. A CSU Recruiter/Advisor can provide further information.

- Anatomy and Physiology I and II
- Chemistry I and II
- Microbiology
- Psychology
- Statistics
- English I and II

### Admission Requirements

1. Schedule an appointment with the Recruiter/Advisor (216) 687-3810 to plan your course of study.
2. Hold an active Ohio Registered Nurse License.
3. Complete all prerequisite coursework with a grade of "C" or higher. Maintain overall prerequisite Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.75 or above.
4. Maintain cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above.
5. Apply to Cleveland State University.
6. Apply to the School of Nursing.



### Course Sequence

The curriculum includes courses from the liberal arts and sciences (general education) and the professional nursing major. The liberal arts and science courses should be taken prior to the nursing sequence. The nursing curriculum provides learning opportunities that foster the development of self-direction, creativity, critical thinking and discriminative judgment.

Clinicals for the NUR 460 Role Practicum are community focused and provide students with a variety of experiential opportunities. The Role Practicum is the capstone course offering students an opportunity to integrate program concepts in an area of nursing practice of their choice.
