


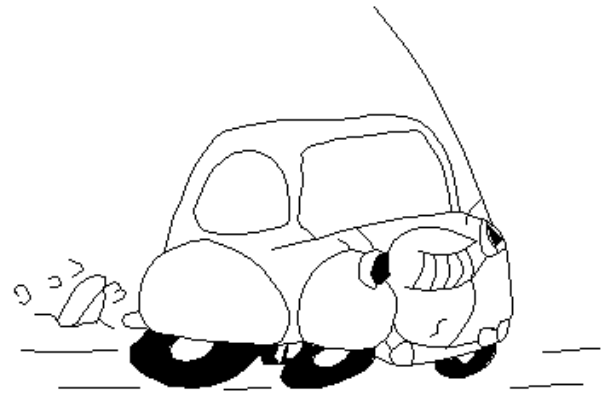

How to **DESCRIBE A PERSON**

- Sex, race, age, nationality
- Height – short, average, tall
- Build – large, medium, small, sticky, fat, slender, thin
- Distinguishing features (tattoos, jewelry, eye glasses)
- Hair – color, thickness, length, thin, balding, fully bald, sideburns
- Speech Characteristics - accents, lisp, etc
- Facial Hair – color(s), position on face, length, trimming
- Complexion – color, scarring, acne
- Clothing – type color, style (start at top and work down: hat, coat, shirt, pants, shoes)
- Weapon – seen or not, firearms, knife, color, type, how carried

- **Note:** compare the suspect’s physical characteristics to yourself or another known person or object (height), especially if similar

How to **DESCRIBE A VEHICLE**

- Color
- Make - Ford, Honda, etc.
- Model – Camry, S10, Focus, Civic, etc.
- Type – 4 doors, 2 doors, convertible, sport utility vehicle, van, etc.
- License number (specify state)
- Other identification – exterior attachments, damage, rust, bumper stickers, window decals, etc.
- Direction of travel and estimated rate of speed
